- 1 Press the box to the right of the candidate of your choice or YES or NO question; a green X will appear to the left of the box X indicating your selection.
- 2 To change a selection, press the box again. The green X will disappear and you may make a new selection.
- 3 Make ALL selections, then press the button located in the lower right corner. This electronically records all of your votes.
- 4 Part the curtains and exit the voting booth.
