
River flooding continues for the next week along the Sabine and Red Rivers.










Rainfall in the Past Week

















River Forecasts

Major flooding is occurring on the Sabine, Neches, and Calcasieu Rivers. Major flooding is expected this weekend on the Red River near Alexandria.











Water levels at the river gage in Orange will hold near 7.5 feet for another 24 hours, however water should slowly drain out of the city of Orange and areas north of I-10 towards Little Cypress during this time.












This could go down as one of the top 10 crests of the Red River.





















US Water Vapor Weather Satellite


Mostly zonal flow is seen in the mid to upper parts of the atmosphere today across our region.














US Infra-Red Weather Satellite


Two frontal systems drape west to east across the US.

US and the other is across the southern US.












6 am Weather Observations











12 pm Weather Observations










Severe Weather Threat This Afternoon and Evening











Rain Totals Friday March 18 2016


Friday will see around a quarter inch for most of the area, except for along and south of the I-10 corridor east of Lake Charles, where they could see half an inch of rain.











Localized Flooding Possible











Severe Weather Threat Friday March 18 2016

There is a very small threat for severe storms on Friday (5%). Large hail or damaging winds would be the primary threat.













Rain Totals Saturday March 19 2016


Saturday will see the most rain in lower Acadiana, where they could have around a quarter inch. Most of this rain should occur in the morning.














Weekly Weather Summary

• Rain and a few thunderstorms are expected this afternoon through Saturday morning. Highest rain totals will be in south central Louisiana where they could see over an inch. There is a small risk for severe storms this afternoon and evening into Friday.


• Cooler temperatures are expected behind a front this weekend. Highs will be in the 60s. Lows Sunday morning will be in the 40s and Monday morning they will range from the mid 30s in central Louisiana to the lower 40s along I-10.

• The next rain event will start next Wednesday, but next Thursday looks like a better chance for rain and a few thunderstorms.











Weekly Weather Summary

- River flooding continues along the Sabine, Neches, Calcasieu, Red River, and the Atchafalaya River near Morgan City.
- Crests have occurred along the Sabine and Neches rivers, but the Calcasieu River will crest at Old Town Bay on Saturday, the Red River near Alexandria will crest late Sunday, and the Atchafalaya River near Morgan City will crest next Friday.
- Be cautious in areas that normally drain into the Sabine, Neches, Calcasieu, and Red Rivers. Due to the high water levels on these rivers, localized flooding could occur due to poor drainage conditions when it is raining this afternoon through Saturday morning.

Weekly Weather Summary

 Along the coast, tides will run <u>above normal</u> with the southerly winds tonight through early Saturday, then run <u>below normal</u> Saturday afternoon through Sunday, and return to <u>above</u> <u>normal</u> conditions next week. Minor flooding during high tide can be expected when tides are above normal.
